<b>Elements of competence</b>		
<b>Summary</b>	The course is designed for those working in a wide range of settings to attain the knowledge and practical competencies required to deal with a range of emergency first aid situations. Learners will need to demonstrate practical administration of safe, prompt, effective first aid in emergency situations with an understanding of the role of the first aider including equipment, record keeping and basic hygiene. The learners will be required to undertake an assessment of their skills and knowledge.	
<b>Who should attend?</b>	This unit is relevant to workers who provide direct support to clients in all care settings – hospital, residential, day- or foster-care or in the client's own home.	
<b>Proposed Learner Outcomes</b> The worker must be able to:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Understand the role and responsibility of an emergency first aider</li> <li>• The importance of preventing cross infection</li> <li>• The need for recording incidents and actions</li> <li>• Use of available equipment</li> <li>• Know how to assess an incident in order to act safely, promptly and effectively in an emergency</li> <li>• Manage an unresponsive casualty who is unconscious (including seizure)</li> <li>• Administer Cardiopulmonary resuscitation</li> <li>• Recognise and assist a casualty who is choking</li> <li>• Manage a casualty who is wounded and bleeding</li> <li>• Manage a casualty who is in shock</li> <li>• Understand how to manage a casualty with a minor injury (including small cuts, grazes and bruises, minor burns and scalds, small splinters)</li> </ul>	
<b>How many candidates may attend?</b>	This training is limited to 12.	

### Equivalent Relevant information

1. Certificates are issued for each learners and if dated, are valid to that period. N.B Learners attending must complete the entire duration of the training to qualify for a certificate.
2. A learner assessment may be required post training for audit and PDP purposes.
