

# Information for Managers

Ref: competency as outlined within the care training code

You may have been asked by your CSCI inspector to ensure your training provider complies under the phrase 'Skills for Care accredited'.

For a training provider, it is generally the services provided by that TP that are accredited. The “accredited” phrase should also refer to both the suitability of the training in respect to the Skills for Care framework, (all our training reflects this -see our mapping on any programme or visit [www.incareservices.com](http://www.incareservices.com)) and our compliance with the care training code issued within the standards and available from the Skills for Care website. In addition, we have a number of specific services that are accredited by the relevant organisations.

All our trainers are contracted under the basis of ‘fit for purpose’, which means simply that they must be competent in the areas that they teach and hold a relevant qualification to do so. There is a minimum requirement of first level nurse and teaching certificate (such as ENB 998, City and Guilds 7306 or equivalent) for clinical topics and NEBOSH or MIOSH for safe practice topics. Manual handling trainers must have a minimum of 5 years hands on experience in addition to the above.

Regarding police checks, none of our instructors are involved with individuals in any vulnerable way, the majority of our training being on site in large groups and trainers are instructed NOT to handle or apply direct care with residents or clients in individual homes. Naturally, we do take up two references for all our contracted trainers and this is considered satisfactory. We also maintain on file copies of all our instructors certificates, which, should a dispute of competency occur, could be made available for reference.
